14 DE MARZO

TERCER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

Tal vez, te has preguntado ¿porque nosotros católicos tenemos la práctica de ofrecer la Misa por una intención particular? (Aquí ponemos las intenciones en el boletín y las decimos normalmente durante la Misa.) La Misa puede ser ofrecida por una intención particular porque creemos que la Misa hace presente el evento salvífico de la Pasión, muerte, y Resurrección de Jesús. Este evento no es solamente simbólico, y no es tampoco una repetición del sacrificio de Jesús. En vez, la Misa nos une al sacrificio único y eternamente fructuoso de Jesús. (Miren el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 1632-1372, especialmente 1366.) Cuando se pide que una Misa sea ofrecida por una intención particular, se pide que el fruto (beneficio) espiritual de esa Misa sea aplicada a esa intención. La persona que la pide se une al sacrificio por su oración y por un ofrecimiento pequeño de dinero (in Arkansas, lo regular es \$10). Solo una intención se puede aplicar a cada Misa, aunque rezamos por muchas personas durante la Misa. Aunque ofrecer una Misa significa orar por alguien, no se puede ofrecer la Misa por un santo canonizado ni por Dios (pero se puede ofrecer la Misa por una *devoción mejor* a un santo o por una *mejor fe* en Dios). El tipo más común de intención de Misa es por el descanso eterno de un difunto amigo o familiar, pero se puede ofrecer la Misa también por una persona viva. Llame a las oficinas de la parroquia si quisiera tener alguna vez la intención de la santa Misa, por lo menos dos semanas antes de la fecha que a usted le gustaría 374-5767.

MASS INTENTIONS-Have you ever wondered why we Catholics have the practice of offering Mass for a specific intention (which we list in the bulletin and normally say during the Mass)? We do this because we believe the Mass re-presents the saving event of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. This event is not merely symbolic nor does it mean that we repeat the sacrifice of Jesus. Rather, the Mass unites us to the one, eternally fruitful sacrifice of Jesus. When one requests a Mass be offered for a specific intention, one is asking that the spiritual fruit (benefits) of that Mass be applied to that intention. The person requesting the intention joins in the sacrifice through prayer as well as through a small monetary offering (\$10). Only one such intention can be applied per Mass, even if we do pray for several people within the Mass. Since a Mass intention is a way of praying for someone, it cannot be offered for a canonized saint or for God (but it can be offered for an increase in devotion to a saint or an increase of faith in God). The most common type of intention requested is for the repose of the soul of a friend or family member, but Mass can also be offered for a living person.

ARM THE PHOTON TORPEDOES-The book of Joshua tells of the Israelites coming into the Promised Land, where they no longer needed to be fed with manna as in the desert. They had been wandering much longer than expected because of their unfaithfulness. But now they are forgiven, and so celebrate the Passover with food from the land. Then we hear the gospel parable about another feast. This one is also a celebration of forgiveness, for the prodigal son has returned to his father. And the father's forgiveness shows us how willing God is to forgive us. And that's where we end the parable, right? Wrong. The parable continues with the older son's complaint about a feast for his brother. That son cannot forgive his brother and is angry at the father for welcoming the prodigal back. This is where we come in. Most of us have no trouble asking God's forgiveness. But we may have trouble forgiving others. We are so used to think in terms of justice that we are not satisfied with forgiveness. When I have been hurt, I feel like hitting back. So we have to ask ourselves who idea of justice do we live by. Is it the human expectation of an eye for an eye? Or is it God's justice, which is mercy and forgiveness? When someone cuts you off in traffic, do you feel like firing the photon torpedo, or offering forgiveness? The Golden Rule could be "Forgive others as you would be forgiven." Jesus gave his life for the sins of the world. Do we have the right to ask for more?
